Each voter can choose up to five projects.

- ❷ IT Infrastructure and Technology Upgrade for SNAP Senior Center's planned new building - \$200,000

### Libraries

- ❶ Security Upgrades for Bellerose, Fresh Meadows, Hollis, and Windsor Park Libraries - \$344,000 total
- ❷ Security Upgrade for Queens Village Library, 94-11 217<sup>th</sup> Street - \$125,000
- ❸ Self Check-in and Check-out Technology Upgrade for Queens Village Library, 94-11 217<sup>th</sup> St. - \$385,000
- ❹ Self Check-out Technology Upgrade for Hollis Library, 202-05 Hillside Avenue - \$200,000

### Parks

- ❶ Bellerose Reading Garden at Bellerose Playground, 249<sup>th</sup> Street between 85<sup>th</sup> & 86<sup>th</sup> Avenues - \$250,000
- ❷ Installation of Fitness Equipment at Cunningham Park, near the track - \$200,000
- ❸ Preservation and Restoration of Captain Dermody Triangle, 216<sup>th</sup> Street and 48<sup>th</sup> Avenue - \$275,000
